

Contrary to popular belief, you can study in the USA post A-Levels/High School and still receive a scholarship. English level 1 in 4 students does not have the required English level to directly integrate classes. They must therefore begin with ESL. ESL (English Second Language) is a semester-long programme allowing international students to improve their English before starting classes at the








